We began the installations of the Solar home lights for all those households which did not have MSEB Grid connection in villages around Sangamner and Akole. We have placed orders to FOSERA and procured lights sized around 150-170 lights spread across different villages. It would take us approx. a month to finish all installations and training.

Priyanj Special School is a school for children with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). It is clearly a school with a difference, being the only ASD School/Centre offering mainstream academics along with life-readiness skills.
