#### Shivabhakta Adivasi Ashramshala-

The first step in education is the vidyalaya or the school. We, with our Rotary Club have built three classrooms for the students of the school. We have also arranged for:-

- A Human Values Kit to develop a strong value system
- Desktop computer, TV, notebooks and stationery
- Facility for conducting Self Defense classes for older girls
- Classroom furniture 58 Sets



We have undertaken an inter-club project with IWC of Coimbatore from District 320. We have provided them with 6000 **Shudhu water purification tablets** to be administered in the slum they are adopting. The tablets, manufactured by Wockhardt Foundation are an inexpensive and complete method of water purification. We exchanged flags with the club as well.



#### Softpro Computer Classes -

After bagging the Best Project Award last year, we have been offered to expand our sessions at the Softpro center. This year we are





helping 22 students of which about 14 are girls. They will complete their computer education in 4 months.
